Fast Start Training (FST)

The first step in any Adult Scout Leader training is **Fast Start Training** – E-Learning. There are Fast Start modules for new parents, committee, Boy Scout and Venture Leaders – <u>Choose Boy Scout or Venture Advisor module</u>. Each is a self-study program, which will take 20 - 30 minutes and should be taken ASAP upon adult registration.

Youth Protection Training (YPT)

This is a classroom/video/discussion format to help you learn about the Boy Scouts policies, guidelines, supplemental safety training, Tour Permits, and "Guide to Safe Scouting" limitations to help protect both our children and adults. This is a must for all registered adult leaders, merit badge counselors and is recommended for all parents. YPT should be renewed every two years, and can be done on-line:

- A. Without a BSA registration number match, adults may not get a confirmation e-mail or completion card.
- B. On-line version cannot answer "what if questions..." that all new parents have
- C. We spend class time discussing the importance of prevention, "Guide to Safe Scouting", Tour Permits, BSA guidelines & what they mean on the Troop or Crew level, other required safety training & where to get it, etc (not covered on-line)
 - D. We talk about the local reporting guidelines & important agencies & contacts to know about in our area (not covered on-line)
- E. We have added new discussion materials to help our parents discuss & keep their children safe while on-line, Myspace, blogs, chat rooms, etc (not covered on-line)
 - F. What does "Age appropriate Guidelines" mean to you and your Scouts?
- G. We can introduce new parents to others and provide resources, connections and other available classes designed to help them deliver the best program.
 - H. What is the Troop or Crew's responsibility regarding Adult Leader Applications and registrations? (not covered on-line)
- I. So, we will continue to offer the Youth Protection classes. Please encourage all to attend one ASAP. The on-line version is fine for leader YPT Renewal certification (should be every two years)
- J. Some Pack and Troop Committees have mandated that ALL adults involved in their Scouting Program will be BSA registered & approved and have Youth Protection training (what a great idea)
- K. Youth Protection Training is REQUIRED (BSÁ National Policy as of May 2006), not just recommended as before, for ALL registered Merit Badge Counselors - please promote this, and encourage 100 % participation ASAP in your Troops and Crews! Only approved BSA Registered & YPT trained Merit Badge Counselors should be working with your boys in your Troops and Crews.

As a chartered organization representative (COR), you hold a key position in Scouting. While there is honor attached to this position, it is not an "honorary" one. Your primary function is to ensure that the chartered organization's Scouting program succeeds. The COR is head of the "Scouting department" in the organization, and as such the responsibilities of the units and leadership selection is ultimately the COR's responsibility. Boy Scout Leader Specifics (BSLST aka SALT)

This is a classroom/video/discussion format concentrating on Troop operations. It is required for Scoutmasters and assistants, and recommended for advancement, outdoor and planning leaders. The three parts are: 1. The role of the adults in a boy-led troop. 2. The outdoor and advancement programs. 3. The troop program planning and troop administration. Outdoor skills are critical to the success of the Boy Scout and Venture scouting program. This is an outdoor, weekend course - using the patrol method, focused on introducing the outdoor skills you & your scouts need to know, and building your

confidence and abilities to conduct outdoor camping experiences. ITOLS is <u>required</u> for Scoutmasters, assistants, Venture and Varsity coaches. Requires Class 1 Medical form, advance registration & fees. May also require prior attendance of "matching" BSLST (Specifics) classes.

Hazardous Weather Training

Effective January 1, 2009, Hazardous Weather training is mandatory for at least one adult on each trip or tour. The on-line course includes training, testing, and additional resources on weather conditions that may be encountered during BSA activities, including lightning, flash floods, tornadoes, hot and cold weather, hail, and hurricanes. Participants who complete the course earn a Weather Smart Certificate of Completion (info. required for Tour Permit). The Hazardous Weather course content is appropriate for Boy Scouts and Venturers as well as all adult leaders.
